Feng Shui Tasks to get the Energy Flowing for the New Year

1. Clean the front door. Make sure that the door doesn't stick and that it opens 'all the way'; and that the hardware is in good repair (doorbell, door handles, locks and hinges).
2. Clear the windows. Clean the windows; move furniture that blocks them; open the curtains and blinds every day to let the sunlight (Chi) in.
3. Clean the window coverings, paying particular attention to removing dust build-up on blinds.
4. Clean your stove. A clean, shining stove stimulates the flow of money.
5. Clean your fridge. A clean, organized fridge filled with healthy food choices stimulates the energy of good health.
6. Turn all the mattresses in the home and change the bed linen all the way to the mattress.
7. Vacuum under the beds and remove all things stored underneath them.
8. Steam-clean your carpets and rugs.
9. When your home is sparkling clean, mist with essential oils – fill a mister bottle with pure water, add a few drops of your favorite oil, shake well and spray throughout your clean home.
